






This was followed by the introduction to NAAC and quality enhancement in Higher Education by Prof. Kulwinder Singh (Retd), Punjabi University Patiala. The key speakers of the day were Dr. Rajender Singh, Principal and Dr. Satbir, Asstt. Prof., Sanatam Dharma College, Ambala Cantt. The whole session was divided into two parts. The first half of the session was delivered by Dr. Rajinder Singh, Principal, the Sanatam Dharma College, Ambala Cantt. He shared his valuable insight on the topic "Introduction to NAAC Revised Assessment & Accreditation Framework" with the objective to educate and train faculties of the college about NAAC new guidelines & upgrade about various criteria and new metrices. Sir was talked about the benchmarking and it is important for each and every institution for its better functioning. He explained that quality consciousness is the key pillar for good documentation, SSR and DVV process as per NAAC instructions. He said each and every report should be prepared according to particular pattern and for this he set number of examples. He highlighted the importance and relevance of the topic in current scenario of Higher Education Institutions. The second half of the session was taken by Dr. Satbir Singh, Asstt. Prof. He expressed his views on NAAC criterion I: Curricular Aspects, he thoroughly laid emphasis on the topic and engaged the audience throughout the session. He shed light on the value-added course, course learning outcomes, program learning outcomes, Curriculum & Syllabi and feedback system. After that there was a query session for the participants. There was a wonderful discussion in the query session.

Day II

On the 2nd successive day of the FDP, the key speaker for the session was Dr. Giridhar Gopal, Asstt. Prof., Dept. of Comp. Sci. He was given welcome with brief introduction. The resource person discussed Criterion V- "Student Support and Progression". He highlighted the importance of the different support systems provided to the students. 




Day III

On the 3rd day Dr. Meenakshi, Co-ordinator of the programme welcomed and introduced Dr. Gulshan Singh, Asstt. Prof. (Chemistry) and Ms. Zeenat Madan, Asstt. Prof, Santan Dharma College, Ambala Cantt., as resource persons. The topic under discussion was criterion III: "Research and Outreach Activities". First half of the criterion was discussed by Dr. Gulshan Singh in detail. He Covered two key indicators of the Criterion III; Resource Mobilization for Research & Research Publications. He explained that institutions can receive funds from Govt. or non- Govt. agencies for the research projects. He also explained that the institutional policy for research funding is important for the institution. He also made clear that the research paper, books published by teachers of an institution is of great importance for the college as well as for the teachers. The presentation used by him was enough to get understand by the learners. Second half of the criterion was delivered by Ms. Zeenat Madan. She covered rest of the two indicators of Criterion III; 'Outreach Activities and Collaboration and Linkages'. She explained that outreach activities can improve learning and promote civic engagement and institutions should encourage students to participate in Outreach Activities.






She also focused on collaboration and linkages for faculty exchange, student exchange, and research as it gives access to the institutions to wide-range of sources of up-to-date information of each area of the institution's work. In the end of the FDP there was question answer session. All the queries of participants were sorted out by the resource persons. At the end of the whole session the co-ordinator Dr. Meenakshi presented vote of thanks to all the dignitaries and participants.

Day IV

The fourth session was started with the warm welcome note by Dr. Meenakshi for the key speaker Dr. Sushil Goswami, Asstt. Prof. Sanatan Dharma College Ambala Cantt. The key speaker discoursed on the criterion IV: "Infrastructure and Learning Resources".





On infrastructure and learning resources, he told that all infrastructural facilities should be properly maintained and for which policy document is approved by the management. He mentioned that college should reveal augmented resources expenses excluding the salary. The focus of this metric, library as a learning resource is on automation of the library, i.e. catalogue, accession and OPAC (Online Public Access Catalogue). On the college website, a reparate page on the library should be shown. The documents on national policies and three streams of teacher education should be available in the library. Besides the library should contain specific information about the books

proceed on loan from other libraries, documents made available to teachers upon their recommendation and list of donated books. Whole criterion was explained by the resource person clearly and doubts raised by the faculty members were clarified. Over all participants learnt a lot from the resource person and thanked him for his valuable views. The key speaker received vote of thanks from the co-ordinator of the programme.

Day V

On the 5th consecutive day of FDP, Mr. Sandeep Singh gave a warm welcome to the resource person Dr. Rajinder Singh, Principal, Sanatam Dharma College, Ambala Cantt. After that, a brief introduction was given for the resource person.

His discussion is about Criterion VI-"Governance, Leadership and Management".

He told about the qualitative and quantitative matrices in detail. He explained the composition and role of IQAC in quality assurance. He told that IQAC reviews teaching-learning process periodically, prepare AQAR and is accountable for Academic Administrative Audit. He clearly guided that vision and mission of the institution must be specific.





He also emphasis that NAAC gives importance to decentralization and participative management. For decentralization, decision making and policy making must be a collaborative process. There must be transparency in every aspect of the institution and for its website must be updated time to time. The institutional strategic plan should be carefully planned and action taken report must be prepared. Regarding faculty empowerment strategies, it was mentioned that FDPs, workshops, orientation programmes either should be organized in the institution or faculty should be allowed to participate in them. Incentives to staff are big source of motivation and must be provided to them. Each and every question was discussed in detail. A number of templates and illustrations were used by the resource person. Question-Answer session was followed by the discussion. All doubts and queries were welcomed by the resource person. At last, Mr. Sandeep Singh Co-ordinator of FDP presented a vote of thanks to all.

Day VI

The sixth day of the Faculty Development Program is started by welcoming the Management Members, Principal, Staff Members, participants from different colleges and Resource Person by Assistant Professor, Mr. Sandeep Singh. Criterion – VII: "Institutional Values and Best Practices' was discussed by Dr. Rajinder Singh, Principal, Sanatan Dharma College. In this, he explained all the key indicators of Criterion-VII and all its qualitative and quantitative metrices in a very simple, elaborative and interesting way. He laid emphasis on the policy document for each Metrix and also explained its significance. He also focused on the paperless office work. Further, he explained the value of code of conduct for students, teachers, administration and other staff. He also described the importance of organizing professional ethics programmes for students, teachers and administrator.





There programmes are most important for the upliftment of the staff and helpful in updating their professional skills. During Technical Session questions were also asked by the participants and all were completely satisfied.






